About Kakkomai:

Kanamari Kakkomai is a folk art, which said to have been started to dance about 250 years ago. When the rice harvest was poor due to continuous drought, to pray to the gods for rain and

a good harvest. Three lions, the female lion, the young lion, and the main lion, play a central role in spinning the tale. In 1996, the Kakkomai was designated as an intangible folk cultural asset by Tateyama City. Today, in addition to participating in local festivals, they are actively involved in various events to pass on and preserve the folk performing art of Kakkomai, which is handed down at Hiyohi Shrine, to future generations. This year marks the 50th anniversary of its revival.
